TOWN OF MOUNT CARMEL, TENNESSEE
AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF MOUNT CARMEL
TENNESSEE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020
GENERAL, DRUG, AND SEWER FUNDS, PASSED BY
ORDINANCE NO. 19-486

WHEREAS, the Town of Mount Carmel adopted the fiscal year 2019-2020 General Fund budget by passage of Ordinance No. 19-486 on June 18, 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tennessee state constitution, Section 24 of Article II, no public money shall be expended except pursuant to appropriations made by law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Municipal Budget Law of 1982, as found in the *Tennessee Code Annotated* §6-56-209, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen has the authority to authorize the budget officer to transfer moneys from one appropriation to another within the same fund; and

WHEREAS, Tax Revenue, and Miscellaneous Revenues for the General Fund will be greater than anticipated; and

WHEREAS, expenses for Police Department and Fire Department expenditures will be greater than anticipated; and

WHEREAS, Tax Revenue, Intergovernmental Revenues, Fines & Forfeitures, and Miscellaneous Revenues are housed within the General Fund for the Town; and

WHEREAS, the expenses for General Government, Financial Administration, Public Safety, Public Works, Solid Waste, Parks and Recreation and Library are housed within the General Fund for the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department went to great effort to sell all unsightly confiscated vehicles in their impound lot; and

WHEREAS, the proceeds from these auctions are deposited into the General Fund but may be transferred to the Drug Fund; and

WHEREAS, the principal for the Sewer Budget was not budgeted; and

WHEREAS, the Sewer Fund contains the necessary funds for the principal on the debt; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN FOR THE TOWN OF MOUNT CARMEL, TENNESSEE THAT CHANGES BE MADE TO THE FISCAL YEAR 19-20 BUDGET AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 19-486 is hereby amended by increasing Police Department expenditures by \$35,000; and increasing Fire Department expenditures by \$285,000; by increasing Tax Revenues by \$66,000; by increasing Misc. Revenue by \$212,000; and by decreasing General Fund by \$42,000

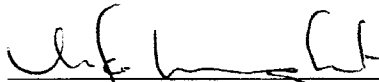
SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 19-486 is hereby further amended by increasing Drug Fund by \$3,675; by decreasing General Fund by \$3,675.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 19-486 is hereby further amended by increasing the Sewer Debt Service expense by \$31,000; by decreasing Sewer Fund by \$31,000.

SECTION 4. The Board of Mayor and Aldermen authorizes the City Recorder to make said changes in the accounting system.

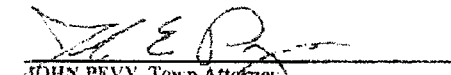
SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage.

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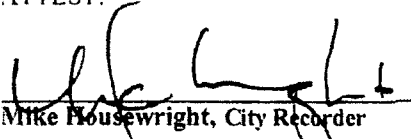
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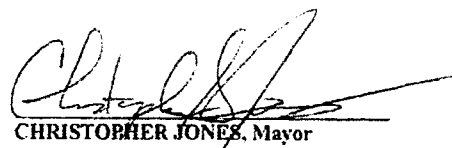
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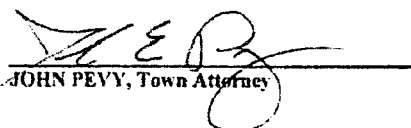
