

RESOLUTION # 175

**BEFORE THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN
MOUNT CARMEL, TENNESSEE**

WHEREAS, Mount Carmel, Tennessee recognizes the need for housing rehabilitation for low and very low income residents within its boundaries; and


WHEREAS, the Town desires to provide housing rehabilitation services to these residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen understands that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development allows for assistance through the HOME program, administered by the Tennessee Housing Development Agency (THDA), to provide housing rehabilitation for low and very low income persons;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Mount Carmel does hereby authorize the Mayor to file an application for \$500,000 in 1999 HOME grant funds from THDA, to be matched with \$25,000 in local funding.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen does hereby authorize the Mayor to sign any and all documents, contracts, assurances, and forms of compliance necessary to effectuate the completion and submittal of the application.
